## Warlies Park Trail

The Trail covers a circular route over undulating ground with mainly grass underfoot.

Warlies Park forms part of the Buffer Lands of Epping Forest, acquired by the City of London Corporation to protect Epping Forest from encroaching development and to maintain the links between the Forest and the wider countryside.

The landscape of the Park demonstrates the rich history and varied influences of the past centuries with parkland, small woodlands, scattered trees and extensive grasslands.

The City of London provides 14 green spaces in and around London for the benefit of local communities. Most are registered charities operating at little cost to the general public.

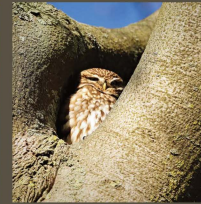

**The Temple**

The Temple rotunda was constructed in 1737 and is now classed as a Scheduled Ancient Monument. There are also two obelisks surviving from the same period, now outside the Park boundary.



**Little owl**

The parkland provides ideal habitats for little owls that are commonly seen in and around the Park.



**Fallow deer**

Fallow and muntjac deer can often be seen, particularly in the northern fields of the Park, together with hares and rabbits.



**Sweet chestnut**

There are some notable old trees dotted around the Park. The stag-headed sweet chestnut by The Temple has a lightning scar running down the length of its trunk, but still thrives.



**Cattle**

As part of the ongoing management of the Park, cattle graze certain areas encouraging the development of a flower-rich sward.



**Ragwort**

The variety of grasses and wildflowers, such as ragwort, encourage many insects such as bees, hoverflies, grasshoppers and butterflies.
