

City of London – Notice of Making

Introduction of a one-way traffic restriction, a banned left turn restriction and removal of a road closure restriction in Old Jewry.

In exercise of the powers conferred by sections 6, 122 and 124 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) and of all other enabling powers, **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Common Council of the City of London has made the three Orders set out in section 1 to this notice, with the effect set out in section 2 to this notice, by amending the orders set out in section 3 to this notice.

1. The following Orders will be made and shall become effective on 5th January 2026:
 - (a) The City of London (One Way Streets) (Amendment No. 26) 2025
 - (b) The City of London (Prohibited and Compulsory Movements) (Amendment No. 22) 2025
 - (c) The City of London (Prescribed Routes) (Road Closure) (Amendment No. 32) 2025
2. The Orders set out in section 1 to this notice will have the following effect:
 - (a) in **Old Jewry** to:-
 - (i) introduce a one-way traffic restriction from north to south for its entire length, except pedal cycles;
 - (ii) introduce a banned left turn except pedal cycles and taxis from Old Jewry into Poultry; and
 - (iii) revoke the road closure restriction at the junction with Cheapside and Poultry.
 - (b) by making the following experimental traffic orders permanent:
 - (i) The City of London (Old Jewry) (No.8) Experimental Order 2024;
 - (ii) The City of London (Prohibited and Compulsory Movements) (Old Jewry) (No. 9) Experimental Order 2024; and
 - (iii) The City of London (Old Jewry) (No.27) Experimental Order 2024.
3. The Orders have been made by amending the following orders:
 - (a) The City of London (One Way Streets) Order 2015 (as amended);
 - (b) The City of London (Prohibited and Compulsory Movements) (Consolidation) (No.1) Order 2019; and
 - (c) The City of London (Prescribed Routes) (Road Closures) (No. 1) Order 2017 (as amended.)

Copies of all orders cited in this notice and the Orders, which will come into operation on 5th January 2026, the statement of reasons for making the Orders, this Notice and plans can be inspected during normal office hours on Monday to Fridays inclusive for a period of six weeks from the date on which the Orders were made at the Technology Support Desk, North Wing, Guildhall, London, EC2V 7HH or on the City of London website at www.cityoflondon.gov.uk/services/streets/traffic-schemes-and-proposals.

Any person desiring to question the validity of the Orders or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied

with may, within six weeks from the date on which the Orders were made, make an application for the purpose to the High Court.
