
Amphitheatre Diorama

Create your own diorama (3D model) of London's Roman Amphitheatre that includes gladiators, a referee and lots of spectators.

You may need some help from adults to cut around the pieces and to glue them onto the base.



What you will need:

- Child-friendly scissors
- Child-friendly glue
- Colouring pens or pencils
- A printout of these pages.


Amphitheatre Diorama


Steps

- 1. Print pages 4 6 (black and white is fine, but one-sided printing).
- 2. Cut around the outside edge of the different pieces (gladiators, spectators etc.), but not the last page (page 6) that will be the base of the model.
- 3. On the largest piece with all the spectators also cut along the 2 short dark lines at the base.
- 4. Colour in all the pieces. You might also want to draw some of your own gladiators or wild animals to add to the model.
- 5. Fold along the dotted line on each piece to create a flap, on which the piece will stand.
- 6. Glue the pieces to the base. Start with the spectators, gluing them at the back on page where marked on page 6. If you have two flaps facing forward and one facing back it will make it more stable.
- 7. Attach all the other pieces. It works well if you have the smallest pieces at the front, and don't forget to keep an open view of the emperor and empress.
